Head: Understanding the Bible

- 1) Read Genesis 29 together. Is there something in this passage that you do not understand?
- 2) Why is Jacob looking for his Uncle Laban? What emotional state is he in right now?
- 3) What caused Jacob to deceive his father? What is the privilege that comes with being the firstborn?
- 4) Why is Jacob so easily deceived by Laban? Why doesn't he fight the injustice?
- 5) Compare Jacob and Leah's relationships with their father?

Heart: Using the Gospel on Our Affections

7) Consider Isaiah 53:1-3 & Matthew 27:39-43. Did Jesus look like he was God's firstborn, the King of Kings? Why did God give you His grace?
