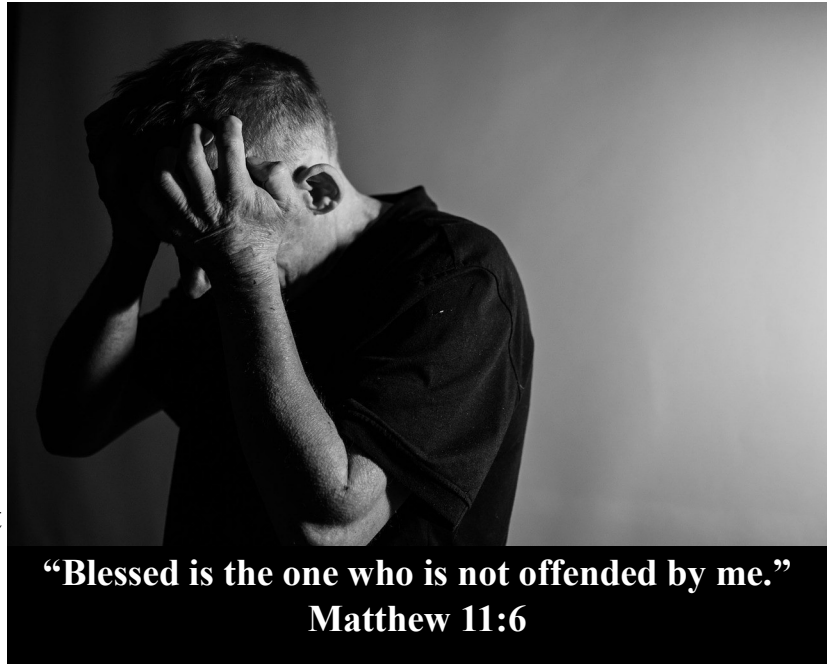

2) What did you find offensive about Jesus before coming to faith? What do you find offensive now?

3) What is John the Baptist scandalized by? What does Jesus basically tell John to do? What is Jesus telling you to do with your doubts and frustrations?

4) How does this passage equip you to talk to skeptical friends about the gospel?

5) Look at verses 16-19. What is Jesus saying about the people listening to him? Compare Jesus and John’s teaching (Matt. 3:2; 4:17). What is the difference between the two? How do people respond? What should you expect then when you talk about Jesus?

6) Pray for one another’s doubts and for the courage to not be ashamed of the gospel.
